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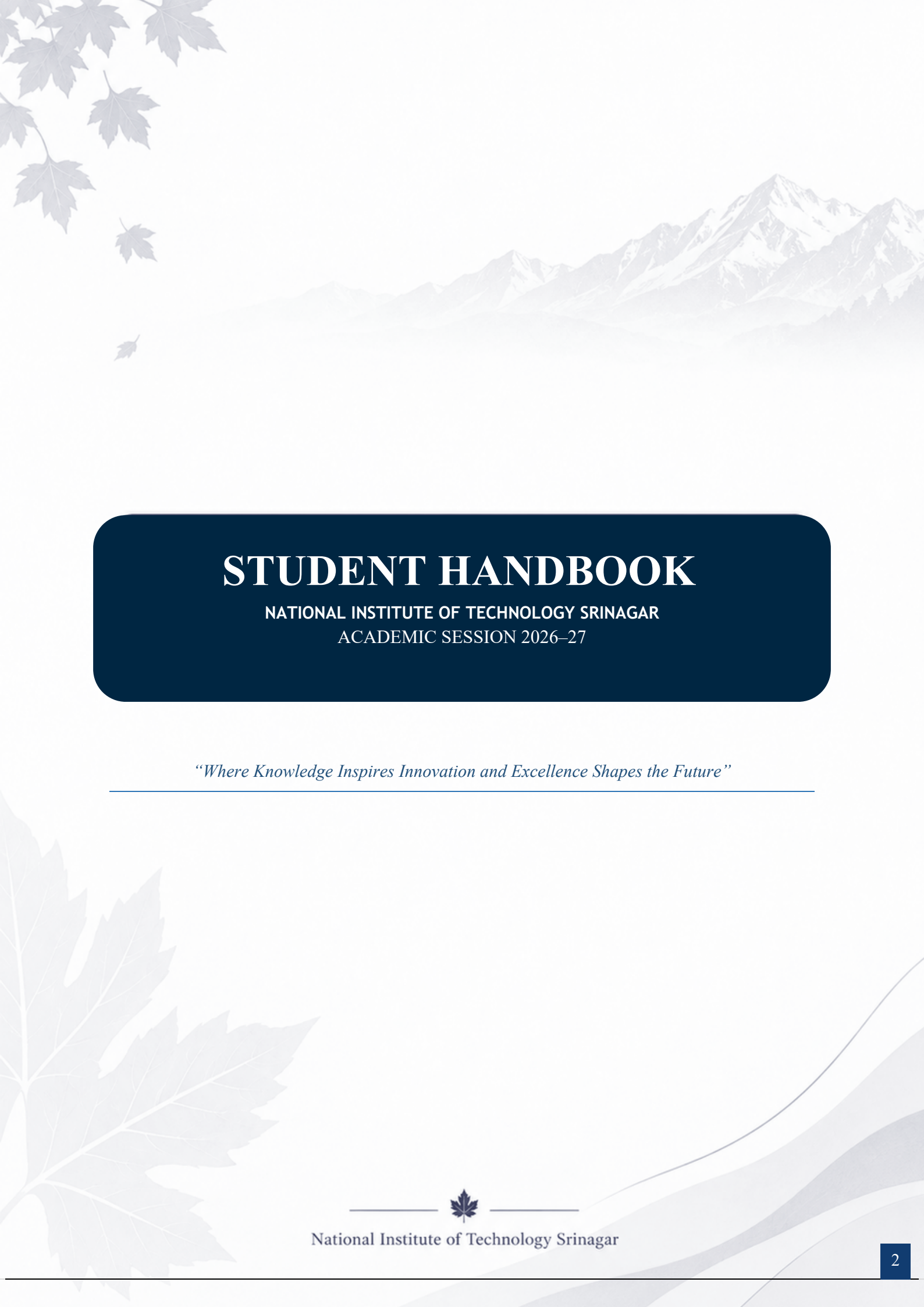

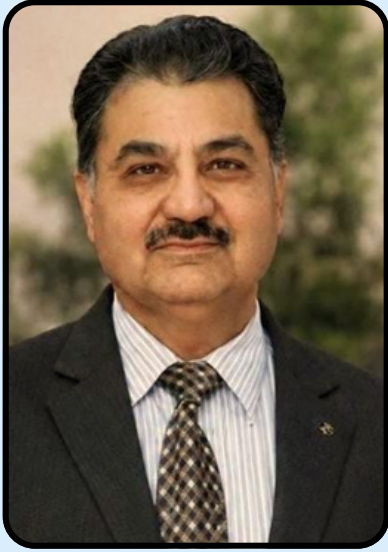

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ABOUT NIT SRINAGAR

National Institute of Technology (NIT) Srinagar is one of the premier educational institutions in the northern region of India. Established in **1960** as one of the eighteen **Regional Engineering Colleges (RECs)** sponsored by the Government of India during the Second Five-Year Plan, the institute was upgraded to the status of a **National Institute of Technology** with **Deemed-to-be University** status in **August 2003**, attaining full academic autonomy.

Situated on the banks of the **world-famous Dal Lake**, with the historic **Hazratbal Shrine** overlooking the campus, NIT Srinagar offers a unique blend of academic excellence and natural beauty. The institute is a **fully residential campus** with hostel and staff accommodation facilities, providing a conducive environment for learning, research, and holistic development.

The institute offers **B.Tech., M.Tech., M.Phil., and Ph.D. programmes** across various disciplines of engineering and technology. Supported by modern infrastructure, the campus provides a wide range of facilities, including **NCC, NSS, Industry Interaction Cell, Students' Activity Centre, Gymnasium, Guest House, Health Centre, Bank, Shopping Complex, Internet Centre, Bus Facility**, and other student amenities.

ABOUT THE HOSTELS (BOYS HOSTEL)



INDUS HOSTEL

This hostel is for 1st year B.Tech students. There are three floors in this hostel. There are separate wardens and Hall Assistant room in this hostel. The capacity of this hostel is 625 students.



JEHLUM HOSTEL

This single-seater hostel is for 4th year B.Tech students and has a total capacity of 290 for students. It has three floors and 300 rooms, divided into six blocks: A, B, C, D, E, and F.



CHENAB HOSTEL

This multi-seater hostel is for 2nd year B.Tech students and has a capacity of 510 students. It consists of three floors with all basic amenities.



JEHLUM EXTENSION

An extended block of the Jhelum Hostel, the Jhelum Extension has a capacity of 176 students and provides similar facilities as the main hostel building.

ABOUT THE HOSTELS (BOYS HOSTEL)



TAWI HOSTEL

Tawi Hostel has a total capacity of 192 students. It is equipped with all basic Mansar amenities required for a comfortable stay.



MANSAR HOSTEL

Designated for 3rd year B.Tech students, and Hostel has two floors accommodates 175 students. Each room is shared by multiple students.



C-BLOCK HOSTEL

This is a smaller hostel facility with a capacity of 60 students. It is used as an additional residential block to support student accommodation needs.



MANASBAL HOSTEL

Designated for 3rd year B.Tech students, Manasbal Hostel has two floors and accommodates 300 students. Each room is shared by multiple students.

ABOUT THE HOSTELS (GIRLS HOSTEL)



Sonzal Hostel

Sonzal Hostel offers a comfortable home for students beginning their academic journey. It features 51 two-seater rooms, accommodating 104 students from the 2023 batch, along with a cosy waiting room and T.V. room for recreation.



Shehjar Hostel

Shehjar Hostel is a newly built residence focused on student comfort and convenience. It has 36 rooms, each accommodating five students, along with a dedicated medical room for timely care and support.



Yemberzal Hostel

Yemberzal Hostel is a modern residence designed for student comfort and convenience. It features 36 rooms, each accommodating five students, along with a dedicated medical room to provide timely care and support when needed.



Zaffran Hostel

Zaffran Hostel provides a warm and comfortable home for newly arrived students. It has 24 rooms, including 6 single-seater and 18 four-seater rooms, offering both privacy and opportunities to build new friendships. A beautiful walnut tree adds a peaceful touch to the hostel grounds.

HOSTEL MANAGEMENT AND RULES

A1. Aims and Objectives of Hostel Management:

- To create an atmosphere of harmony and co-operation amongst the boarders.
- To provide the boarders a peaceful and calm environment to enable them to excel in every aspect of their personality development.
- To create a sense of responsibility amongst the boarders and to inculcate discipline.
- To provide good quality food for boarders to keep them fit and healthy.

There will be two Wardens and at least one Hall Assistant for each hostel. All the Wardens and Hall Assistants will act under the supervision and directions of DSW. The policy framework/decisions regarding hostels shall be decided by DSW in consultation with Wardens. These decisions will be implemented by the Wardens and Hall Assistants. The decision of DSW and Wardens in their respective jurisdictions shall be final.

A2. Dos, Don't & Forbidden Activities

Do's:

- Be responsible and report any kind of indiscipline activity in the hostel to the concerned Warden/DSW.
- Be respectful to your teachers and staff of the Institute. Be honest, courteous & truthful.
- Be neat and clean. Maintain hygiene in the room and hostel premises. Cleanliness is the shared responsibility.
- Seek permission for group activities. Any celebration without permission will be treated as illegal.
- Be co-operative and exhibit team spirit for positive attitude and conduct.
- Have and maintain exemplary behavior and show respect for the feelings of others.
- Boarders going out of the campus should ensure proper entry in the in/out register maintained by the Security Guard.
- Be open, friendly, and engage in social activities, but always respect others' personal space and boundaries.
- Use headphones if you are listening to music or watching videos. Do not disturb others.
- Keep your belongings in your space.
- Be mindful of shared bathrooms.

Don'ts :

- Consumption of alcoholic drinks and/or narcotic drugs, and smoking in and around Institute premises is strictly prohibited.
- Students should not enter the hostel in an intoxicated state or possess such materials.
- Do not post any objectionable content on social media sites and strictly follow the guidelines of IT policy for usage of internet services.

Don'ts:

- Do not use abusive or rough language in the Institute premises.
- Do not pass casteist, anti-religious, or racial comments.
- Do not cause hurt by your words and deeds.
- Do not be afraid to speak the truth or to accept a mistake.
- Do not steal.
- Do not waste water. Use it judiciously.
- Do not leave valuables like your phone, wallet, or laptop unattended in public spaces.
- Do not bring any pet or animal with you.
- Do not provide fake contact details of your parents. If found, you will be liable for action.
- Do not hide your health history, if any. Consult the Institute Health Centre as and when required.
- Creating any form of sound pollution, including playing music loudly, is not allowed.
- Opposite-sex visitors are not permitted to visit the boys' hostel in any case whatsoever.
- Any conduct that leads to lowering the esteem of the Institute is strictly prohibited.
- Ragging is a criminal offence; students are strongly advised to refrain from it.
- Casteism, communalism, forming sectarian groups, and the practice of untouchability.

Forbidden Activities:

- Ragging and violence in any form.
- Do not damage or disfigure property of the Institute.
- Rude and disorderly behavior.
- Gender-related offences.
- Smoking, chewing tobacco/tobacco products, pan masala, spitting, etc.
- Use of drugs or intoxicants.
- Any form of gambling.
- Possession or usage of weapons, explosives, or anything that causes injury/damage.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINARY CODE FOR THE INMATES OF THE HOSTELS

It is the responsibility and duty of each and every student of the Institute to become acquainted with “Conduct and Disciplinary Code”. It is presumed that every student from the date of his/her admission to the Institute has knowledge of this code. All students are required to strictly adhere to this code as a condition of their admission to the Institute and these rules would be binding on and enforceable against them or any one among them. Violation of any rule will make the inmate liable to disciplinary action which may lead to expulsion from the hostels and also from the Institute.

I: RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE STUDENTS

It shall be the responsibility of the students

1. To behave and conduct themselves in the Institute campus, hostels and premises in a dignified and courteous manner and show due respect to the authorities, employees and elders.
2. To follow decent and formal dressing manners. Students should avoid clothing depicting illegal drugs, alcohol, profane language, racial, sexual and vulgar captions etc.
3. To access all educational opportunities and benefits available at the Institute and make good use of them to prosper academically and develop scientific temperament.
4. To respect the laws of the country, human rights and to conduct themselves in a responsible and dignified manner at all times.
5. To report any violation of this Code to the functionaries under this Code.

II: BEHAVIOR OF THE STUDENTS

6. A student once admitted in the hostel will continue to be a hostel inmate throughout the year unless otherwise debarred from the hostel on disciplinary grounds.
2. Every student should stay in the room allotted to him/her. Mutual exchange of rooms after final allotment is not allowed.
3. Room furniture, electrical fittings etc. are required to be maintained by the students in good condition. Students while vacating the hostel, during vacations, can leave their belongings in rooms with prior permission from Hostel Management.
4. Residents shall occupy the rooms only after allotment is made by the concerned warden. Change of room may be permitted in exceptional cases, provided it is deemed necessary/justified by the Dean/Associate Dean Students Welfare, after recommendation of the concerned warden. Unauthorized occupation of a room or exchange of rooms shall be treated as a serious violation of rules. Residents found guilty of such violation of the hostel rules shall be expelled from the hostels without prior notice/enquiry.
5. No parent or guardian of a student is permitted to stay in any hostel. They must obtain prior permission from the Faculty-Incharge Guest House to stay in the Institute Guest House only, if such accommodation is available for a specific period, on payment basis, as per the Guest House accommodation rules.
6. Hostel Boarders shall not remain absent from their hostels for any purpose including excursion or picnic during night between 7:30 pm to 7:00 am without the prior permission of the Warden.

7. Every student, desirous of leaving station, shall apply to the hostel warden in a prescribed form stating reasons, period, destination and contact address for the days of absence. No student shall leave the station without obtaining prior written permission from the hostel warden.
8. Any student desirous of remaining outside the hostel premise for visiting Central Library or the Computer Centre shall enter the details of their whereabouts in the temporary absence register kept for the purpose.
9. Wrong entry, improper/lack of entry in exit register, signing on behalf of another person, tampering with the entries, proxy attendance and misguidance of any nature are punishable. Absentees/Late comers (without prior permission from the Warden) will be suitably fined.
10. Students coming late/or remaining absent regularly will be expelled from the Hostel. Such students shall not be readmitted under any circumstances.
11. Without specific permission of the hostel authorities, students shall not bring outsiders to the institute or hostels.
12. Visitors are not permitted in the hostel after 7:30 pm. However, in special cases, prior permission of Dean Students Welfare through respective Warden must be obtained to stay beyond these hours.
13. Spreading rumors, filing false complaints either in written form or through e-mail, if proved, would be considered an act of serious misconduct or indiscipline.
14. The boarders are required to refrain from indulging in any activity leading to cyber-crime. They should not use social websites to defame others and misuse the internet.
15. Groupism of any kind that may distort the harmony is not permitted.
16. Posts, tweets, retweets, etc. on social networking sites which may vitiate the peaceful environment of the Institute are strictly prohibited. Strict action shall be taken against the defaulters.
17. The students are required to carry their identity cards with them when they have to move inside or outside the campus.
18. **Ragging is a criminal offence: students are strongly advised to refrain from it.**
19. Students are prohibited from indulging in anti-institutional, anti-national, antisocial, communal, immoral or political expressions and activities within the campus and hostels. No gender-based, caste-based, religion-based and region-based comments/statements are acceptable from the students/hostel residents.
20. Political based student unions and other organizations are not allowed in the campus. Students are strictly prohibited from organizing, attending or participating in any activity or agitation sponsored by political based organizations.
21. Any student found involved in making comments on political parties or govt and making anti national comments or statements and sharing it on social media (like twitter, facebook, whats App etc) will be liable to strict disciplinary action including expulsion from hostel with immediate effect. He /She will be suspended from classes or may be rusticated and will be liable for suitable legal action.
22. Any type of students' gathering/campaign/agitation/protest and threatening the faculty/staff/student is not permitted in the premises of the hostel/Institute. However, any campaign for social awareness or well being or social concern may be organized with the prior permission of competent authority.

23. The students should not indulge in defacing the building or any structure by writing slogans. Students shall not deface, disfigure, damage, vandalize or cause any loss in any manner to public, private or Institute properties.
24. Each student shall use only LED light/energy saver in the hostel room. Use of all unauthorized electrical appliances such as heaters, induction, electric kettle, iron, etc. is strictly prohibited and these will be confiscated, and the concerned student will be penalized. However, use of computer and printer in the hostel room will be allowed with prior permission from the Dean Students Welfare through respective Warden.
25. A student who possesses a personal computer/laptop should register it in the Hostel Office. A student who wishes to take his/her personal computer outside the campus will have to contact the Hostel Office in person and get permission by producing: a) The original bill for the purchase of the computer, and b) Identity card.
26. No student shall indulge in any act involving transfer of articles, fittings, furniture or gadgets from Common Room, Dining Hall, Kitchen, Passage, Foyer, Portico, Warden's Office, Store, Computer Room, etc. to his/her room or to any other place.
27. Fans and lights must be switched off when the students leave their rooms. Lights must be switched off positively during night hours. In case it is noticed that fans/lights are on in the locked rooms, a maximum penalty will be imposed on him/her.
28. Every student residing in the hostel must dine in the allotted mess only. Cooking in the rooms is strictly prohibited. Any student violating this norm shall be heavily fined.
29. The boarders are expected to live in the hostel as a community and with a full sense of responsibility. They should behave with restraint, maintain decorum and should not act in any fashion which may cause disturbance to anybody. The boarders shall observe 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM as silence hours. The boarders are expected to be in their rooms from 10:00 PM onwards till the next morning.
30. Playing music and videos, etc. at high volume inside the rooms is strictly prohibited as it causes disturbance to the inmates. Any such complaint against boarders will be viewed very seriously and gadgets will be seized along with imposition of heavy fine.
31. Clock alarms should be switched off when not in use. There have been instances when students have set the alarm and gone on long leave, and some of them keep on ringing for hours and spoil the peace of fellow hostellers.
32. The inmates are not supposed to use firecrackers in the corridors or within the hostel buildings. They are also not allowed to spill water inside the corridors during any festivals.
33. Water should be carefully used and not wasted.
34. Every inmate of the hostel shall pay the mess bill and other charges before the stipulated date, failing which fines will be imposed as per rules and regulations. The approved rules regarding mess rebate will be applied to all the inmates of the hostel. Mess exemption on medical grounds will be allowed under exceptional conditions. However, there will be no exemption in payment of service charge.
35. Block Volunteers/Mess Volunteers will be selected on merit or as desired by the Warden from among the Block/Mess students to assist him/her in the supervision of hostel block/mess and in enforcing discipline.
36. No one shall bring, distribute or circulate unauthorized notices, pamphlets, leaflets, etc., within the campus or hostels. The possession, distribution, exhibition or circulation of any item, by any means, which is per se obscene, is prohibited within the campus or on any property owned/managed by the Institute.

37. No student shall collect money either by request or by coercion from others within the campus or hostels.
38. The Institute being a place of learning and an exclusive academic zone, nobody shall respond to any call for any form of strike, procession or agitation including slogan shouting, dharna, gherao, burning of effigy or indulge in anything which may harm the peaceful atmosphere of the Institution and shall abstain from any sort of violence in the campus.
39. The boarders are not allowed to keep with them any explosives, firearms or weapons even if they possess license thereof.
40. The boarders are not allowed to keep motorized vehicles with them in the campus. However, in exceptional circumstances e.g. in case of disability, the boarders may use these with prior approval of the Dean (Student Welfare) through respective Warden.
41. Students shall only use the waste bins for dispensing waste materials within the campus including classrooms, hostels, offices, canteen and messes.
42. **Any conduct which leads to lowering of the esteem of the Institute is prohibited.**
43. Any unauthorized tour/visit by an individual or group of students shall be treated as a serious conduct violation and all such students will be imposed disciplinary penalties.
44. Any act of manhandling, group fighting, intimidation or violence, willful damage to property or drunken behavior, both inside and outside the campus constitutes a breach of discipline and is considered a serious offence. In case of any quarrel between boarders or other persons, it should be reported to the Warden for appropriate action.
45. Inmates should not play cricket, football etc. in the Common Hall or inside or in front of the hostels. It may cause damage to the hostel property in addition to disturbing the peaceful atmosphere.
46. All the hostellers are to note that electrical/carpentry/plumbing complaints should be given in writing to Warden Concerned or written in the complaint register available in the Hostel Office. In case, the complaint is not attended to or there is any difficulty, the students may contact the office of Dean Students Welfare.
47. **Female visitors and girl students are not permitted to visit the boys hostel in any case whatsoever.**
48. Male visitors including parents/guardians are not permitted in any case into the Girls Hostel. However, in special cases, prior permission may be sought from the management in exceptional conditions.
49. Female visitors are not permitted after 7:00 pm in the Girls Hostel
50. All girl students must be present in their rooms before 7:30 pm. Girl students must take prior permission from the concerned warden/Associate Dean Students Welfare for leaving the campus, in case of urgent necessities only. They must enter their movements in the register provided while going out and reporting in.
51. The room of any student in the hostel can be inspected at any time by the Warden/Associate Dean Students Welfare or any authorized member of the Institute staff or district police officials. Inmates are advised to keep their identity cards with them and produce on demand.
52. The use of fire crackers on any occasion inside the hostel or within the premises of the hostel is not permitted.

53. Inmates are prohibited from writing slogans or any writings obscene drawings on the hostel walls and rooms. Heavy penalties will be imposed on students/groups of students found indulged in such acts.
54. The jurisdiction of NIT Srinagar is confined to the campus. If any student creates law and order problems outside the campus, they are answerable to the police.
55. As per the notification issued by the Law enforcement agencies, the entire Institution is a smoking free zone and the boarders are supposed to abide by this.
56. The consumption of alcoholic drinks and/or narcotic drugs in and around hostel premises is strictly prohibited. Students should be very careful and should not fall in any kind of temptation for any unlawful activities from an outsider or person from inside the institute. Rules of Government of India for Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 and its further amendments will be implemented strictly. Those involved in consuming prohibited items may be handed over to the local police by the Warden after informing competent authority.
57. The boarders are not allowed to gamble inside campus premises as well as in their hostel rooms.
58. The boarders shall not indulge in any act of theft, immoral acts, misbehavior with hostel/mess staff, spread of regionalism, communalism and casteism etc.
59. Any celebration without permission will be treated as illegal.
60. The students are not allowed to convene any meeting in or around the hostel without the permission of Warden.
61. Boarders should not go to print media/press in any circumstances without prior permission of the authority.
62. The boarders must abide by the instructions conveyed by the institute authorities from time to time for smooth functioning of hostels.
63. The Institute/hostel authorities may visit/inspect the room of the boarders any time to ensure proper cleanliness and other discipline related matters. The student cannot object it as a matter of privacy. The student objecting/creating problems during room's inspection may face disciplinary action.
64. In case of any emergency all the boarders should report the matter to any Institute/Hostel authority or employee on duty.
65. The boarders should avoid keeping costly items like jewelry, electronic gadgets etc. They should ensure proper security of their valuable items such as purse/wallet, debit/credit card (if any), calculators, cell phones, computers, laptops, and books etc. In case of theft or loss of any items it will not normally be possible to carry out any investigation. The boarders are advised to keep their rooms, boxes, suitcases, cupboards, etc., securely locked with good quality locks. The boarders themselves are personally responsible to safeguard their belongings. Any theft of laptop, mobile phone, computer, purse, calculator, wrist watch, wallet or any other valuable item is the sole responsibility of the boarder. Hostel authorities will not be responsible for any theft or damage of such items.
66. Boarders going out of the campus should ensure proper entry in the in/out register maintained by Security Guard.
67. Boarders have to keep their rooms properly locked while going out of their respective rooms

68. The boarders are supposed not to visit areas which may endanger their life. They are advised to refrain from taking adventurous trips to river side such as Jhelum/Dal lake or other watery areas or to take trekking expeditions or any other risky sport which may result in loss of human life. They are also advised not to visit rooftops etc. and endanger their safety.
69. The Warden of the concerned hostel may rusticate the boarder for violating any of the conditions specified above.

III: DISCIPLINARY SANCTIONS

Any student exhibiting prohibited behaviour, mentioned in this Code shall, depending upon the intensity of the misconduct or depending on its recurrence, be subjected to any of the following disciplinary sanctions. Any student who is persistently insubordinate, who is repeatedly or wilfully mischievous, who is guilty of fraud, in the opinion of the competent authority, is likely to have an unwholesome influence on his/ her fellow students, will be removed from the rolls.

A. Minor Sanctions

- 1. Warning or Reprimand:** This is the least sanction envisaged in this Code. The student engaged in any prohibited behaviour will be issued a warning letter.
- 2. Tendering Apology:** The student, whosoever is found engaged in any prohibited behaviour, may be asked to tender an apology for his/her act and undertaking that he/she shall not indulge in such act or any of the prohibited behaviour in future.

B. Major Sanctions

- 1. Debarring from Examinations:** A student/group of students may be debarred from writing the examinations, which forms part of the academic program for which he/she/they has/ have joined.
- 2. Suspension:** A student may be suspended from the Institute for violation of any of the provisions of this Code. The period of suspension and conditions, if any, shall be clearly indicated in the communication addressed to the student. The student shall lose his/her attendance for the suspended period.
- 3. Restitution:** Restitution implies reimbursement in terms of money and/or services to compensate for personal injury or loss, damage/disfiguration to property of the Institute or any property kept in the premises of the Institute in any manner. The students/group of students may be asked to compensate for the loss that has been caused to any person or property of the Institute or any property kept in the premises of the Institute due to the act of vandalism perpetrated by the students. The students/group of students shall also be liable to put in their service to restore any loss or damage caused to any property and thereby bringing it to its original form if it is possible.
- 4. Forfeiture:** Caution deposit of any student engaged in any prohibited behaviour shall be forfeited.
- 5. Expulsion:** This is the extreme form of disciplinary action and shall be resorted to only in cases where stringent action is warranted. Expulsion is the permanent dismissal of a student from the Institute. Such a student will not be eligible for readmission to any of the courses of this Institute.

IV: FUNCTIONARIES UNDER THE CODE

- 1. Associate Deans/ Wardens of Hostels:** As the persons in charge of the Hostels, the respective functionaries of all the Hostels shall have the power and duty to take immediate

action to curb any prohibited behavior as envisaged under this code. The Wardens of Hostels, while taking any action as envisaged in the code, shall do so in an impartial manner and see to it that the sanction imposed/proposed is commensurate according to intensity of the prohibited behavior. The Wardens of Hostels shall be responsible for maintaining strict discipline and decorum in the hostel. He/she shall specifically see to it that the inmates of the hostel do not involve themselves in violation of any clause under Section II of this Code.

2. Dean Students Welfare: The Wardens of Hostels shall report to the Dean Students Welfare for any instances of prohibited behavior, who in turn shall bring it to the notice of the Director. The Dean Students Welfare shall forward the recommendations from the Warden to impose a major sanction under Section III B of this Code to the Director after noting his observations. The Dean Students Welfare can also Suo moto recommend action against any student/students indulging in prohibited behavior which is brought to his/ her notice.

3. Director: The Director shall be the ultimate authority in imposing major sanctions as envisaged under Section III B against the students for acts of prohibited behavior. The Director can also entertain any appeal from any student/students aggrieved by the action of any authority of the Institute under or subordinate to the Director and decide the case on merit.

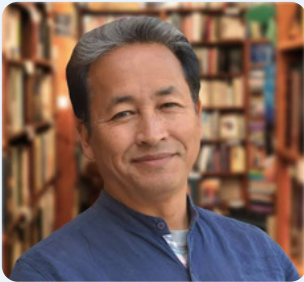
